Bishop Denis responds to the recent Referendum Result:

While visiting Florence in November 2015 Pope Francis remarked that Catholics must realise "*we are not living an era of change but a change of era*".

I very much empathise with this remark following last Friday's Referendum result that sees the equal right to life of the mother and the baby in the womb being deleted from our Constitution. Whether you voted 'Yes' or 'No' this is my message for you. As you know, I like many advocated and reasoned for a 'No' vote. That was not to be, and by a very clear majority the referendum was carried. That vote must be respected, but equally those who voted 'No' must be encouraged. Like me, your hearts are probably down, this was not the result you intended or wished for. Of course, the Referendum result doesn't change what the Church believes about the sacredness of life nor the call to proclaim that belief in a positive way in word and deed.

I commend and thank all who campaigned door to door in the Diocese, attended meetings and contributed to the public debate. I know that many people prayed deeply about this issue. We need to continue all these efforts. I would like to echo the invitation from Archbishop Eamon Martin in his New Year Message last January for us all to "become missionaries for life". That call is louder and bolder today than ever.

In every parish there will be people who voted 'No' last Friday and people who voted 'Yes'. In finding the way forward together, it is vital that we witness to our Christian calling as one rooted in love, love for all.

Ultimately, the Church must live in this new space we find ourselves, it may not be comfortable and at times may be very challenging. As I said in my recent statement before the referendum, we must work even harder to strengthen a culture that values all life and advocates for all who are in need of protection in our society. Let us rededicate ourselves to this essential and blessed task.

SAINTS AND FEAST DAYS

Monday – St Kevin was a native of Leinster and grew up in Kilnamanagh, where he received his early religious formation. Wishing to be a hermit, he crossed the mountains to Glendalough and settled in Disert Caoimhghin at the foot of the upper lake. But disciples began to gather round him. Gradually the great monastic settlement grew and spread through the glen after his death in 618.

Tuesday – St Boniface, 673-754, was born at Crediton in Devonshire. He founded monasteries in Bavaria, including Fulda in 735.

Wednesday – St Jarlath is said to have been a disciple of St Enda, and was taught by St Benignus. He became abbot bishop of the monastery he founded at Tuam.

Thursday – St Colman of Dromore, Co. Down, spent most of his life in that area. Possibly he studied under Caetan of Nendrom, and was persuaded by St Mac Nissi to settle at Dromore c. 514.

Friday – The Sacred Heart of Jesus. 'Understood in the light of the Scriptures, the term 'Sacred Heart of Jesus' denotes the entire mystery of Christ: Son of God, uncreated wisdom; infinite charity, principle of the salvation and sanctification of mankind'

Saturday – The Immaculate Heart of Mary. The Church celebrates the liturgical memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary the day after the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The contiguity of both celebrations is a sign of their close connection. St Columba, also known as Colum Cille, was born in Gartan, Co. Donegal in 521 and was of royal lineage. He founded monasteries in Derry, Durrow, Iona and possibly Kells.

He died 9th June 597.
