- 3. Jesus prayed that his followers would be one, something unfortunately still far from a reality. Perhaps you have experienced both the pain of division and the joy of unity. Recall times when you felt a deep unity with others. What lessons did you learn from the experience?

### ST. JOHN HENRY NEWMAN

The newly canonised St. John Henry Newman once wrote, "Prayer is to the spiritual life what the beating of the pulse and the drawing of the breath are to the life of the body." Newman's doctrine, to pray always, is founded on his firm conviction that Christ dwells in the heart of every Christian. Jesus is present to us, calling each of us to holiness, relying always on His power by turning to Him in prayer.

Far from being esoteric and idiosyncratic, the core of Newman's spirituality falls right from the lips of Jesus. "Pray always," our Lord exhorts us, "without becoming weary" (Luke 1:18). Like a persistent widow pleading her case before a judge, we should continually, relentlessly, implore the Lord for all that we need.

To constantly turn our minds to God, Eastern Christianity offers the Church the rich tradition known as the "Jesus Prayer." The prayer is a simple phrase, "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner." It can be offered as the air we breathe, in time with the beating of our hearts.

This week may our prayer become as the air we breathe: drawn simply, reflexively, constantly, and filled with life!
