LOOKING BACK THE YEARS

January 1982 the secretary of the club wrote a letter to Fr O'Farrell parochial house Kiltegan Fr Bernard Ryan PP Rathvilly, Bishop Lennon Carlow stating in the letter that the centenary year of the GAA was fast approaching in 1984 and the club would like to buy the parish field so they could have a home of their own.

December 2nd the secretary received a letter from Kinsella Estate Auctioneers that the parish field approx. 6 acres and the parochial house was for sale by private treaty.

A club meeting was held within a few days 14th December another meeting on 22nd December when an opening bid of £15,000 was offered. Further meetings were held & long discussions took place in January with further bids on the property.

On 1st February 1983 a meeting in Kinsella Estate office in Baltinglass with Fr Ryan, Fr Little & Joe Kinsella auctioneer, Declan Dovle, John Timmins. The field & house was bought for £25,000.

A committee meeting was held on the 4th February where the committee were informed and a major fund raising project was put in place. Development work, lighting the field, drawing clay and many other items were done this year.
