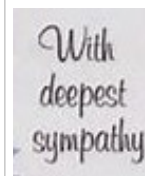

1971 History Matters 1972

TURNING BACK THE YEARS

Hurling in the GAA club was making some small progress in 1971. We beat Dunlavin in the West Junior Hurling League 5-12 to 1-1. Drew with Hollywood 1-7 to 3-1 in the West Championship and won the replay 2-6 to 1-6.

We played Newcastle in the County Junior semi-final on March 12th 1972 in the County grounds in Aughrim. This was a new venture for our club, some did not know the way to Aughrim, more got lost on the way.

Newcastle won the game 1-6 to 0-6.

The 1971 Junior Hurling League Final was played in Baltinglass on March 26th '72, which ended in a draw, Kiltegan 1-5 to 2-2. The final replay at Blessington was called off. Two week's later, on the third attempt, we won 5-10 to 1-2, the first medal to come to our club. Celebrations were held in Pat O'Brien's pub later that evening.
