- 1. 'I was there first'. Envy easily comes to the surface when faced with the good fortune of others, especially when compared to what seems less favourable treatment of ourselves. Can you recall that feeling in yourself and what it did to you? Can you also recall times when you were content with your lot, even though it seemed others had greater gifts, better opportunities, etc.
- A parent or teacher who gives a lot of time to a difficult child does not love the others less, but if we are one of those other children we may not see that. Recall a 'Jesus person' in your life who helped you to overcome feelings of envy and helped you appreciate that the apparently more favourable treatment of another did not mean a lessening of love for you.
- This leads us to the core message of this parable, namely, that God's love is a free 3. gift, and not earned. SEASON OF CREATION, 1st Sept – 4th Oct – continued from last week A Time to Rest: In his wisdom. God set aside the Sabbath so that the land and its inhabitants could rest and be renewed.
