Jeffrey Bermingham was the man of the match when Wicklow beat Carlow in the under 21 Hurling Championship.

The Wicklow minor hurlers, managed by Eugene Byrne, won the Leinster League. Alan Byrne & Padraig Farrell were among the star players while Nigel Nolan. Anthony Furlong and Eoin O' Neill were in the subs.

Our Senior football team beat Blessington in the final game in the County Senior League 0-7 to 1-2. The stars were in the defence half back line of Lorcan Byrne, Adrian Byrne & Jeffery Bermingham being outstanding scorers. A. Foley, N. Bermingham, D. Daly, N. Cremin and J. Minister of Transport and Power Mr. Peter Barry, TD, unveiled the Tidy Towns plague on the Village green, it's still there on the green. The minister also addressed the gathering and congratulated the committee and workers on their great achievement. Kiltegan had achieved their goal and put our village on the map for all times. The village had many bus loads of visitors throughout the year from various Tidy Towns committees from all over Ireland and day trippers also. Trim in Co. Meath were the overall winners in 1972 and were the first to congratulate Kiltegan on their success. St. Patrick's College was the venue for the luncheon for the many special guests and committee. Humewood estate was the venue for car & bus parking with the permission of the owner Madame Hume Weygand who was also joint president of the Tidy Towns with Fr. Paddy Moore and Reverend Mr. Morrow

On a sad note, that day while all the celebrating was going on, one of the car park attendants who lived and worked in Humewood estate all his life dropped dead while parking cars he would have also worked on the Tidy Towns. Rest in Peace Christopher Chris Doyle as he was known.
