# **Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time** – Deacon Liam Dunne

In the Gospel Reading Jesus places the commandment of God; the Word of God, above what the Pharisees call the tradition of the elders, the various oral and written traditions that had developed over the centuries in an effort to apply the commandment of God, the Word of God, to daily life. This body of tradition was a genuine effort to bring the Word of God in Scripture to bear on the concrete details of people's lives, such as how and what to eat, which is the issue in today's Gospel Reading. There is always the danger that such religious traditions can assume authority equivalent to or even greater than the authority of God's Word. Jesus is calling on the guardians of this tradition to return to the source of the tradition, the Word of God.

Every religion has to keep returning to its sources so as to ensure that the traditions that have grown over the centuries do not become more important than those sources. For the Church, the sources are the Scriptures, especially the New Testament, and the early tradition that emerged through reflecting upon the living out the Lord's Word. The work of the Second Vatican Council was a movement of returning to the sources.

The Lord can never be fully contained by the Church's traditions. Those traditions need to be constantly purified by exposure to the Word of God, especially as found in the New Testament. As a community of faith, but also as individual believers, we need to keep returning to the source, to the well, the living and active Word of God, so that the Lord can continue to renew and reshape us in his own living image and likeness. ## Pope Francis appoints Fr John McEvoy as "Chaplain to His Holiness"

I am delighted to announce that Pope Francis has honoured Fr John McEvoy, Parish Priest of Rathvilly and Vice President of Carlow College St Patricks, appointing him as a "Chaplain to His Holiness" with the title of Monsignor. This is a very joyful occasion for the Diocese, for Carlow College St Patricks and for Msgr. John and his family.

It is a public recognition of his longstanding contribution to Carlow College St Patricks, his priestly ministry and his many commitments at diocesan level. In honouring Msgr. John I see this as honouring all priests and people of the parishes of Kildare & Leighlin for their continued service to the church and the building up of Gods Kingdom.

Msgr. John is a native of Ballyroan, Co Laois and was ordained on the 27<sup>th</sup> of June 1976. He is currently Parish Priest of Rathvilly, Vice President of Carlow College, St. Patricks and Team Leader supporting the Permanent Diaconate. Previous parish appointments were in Tinryland and Paulstown parishes.

The title "Monsignor" is an honorific form of address granted by the Pope, upon recommendation by his Bishop, to a diocesan priest who has rendered valuable service to the local church or who has provided a specific and specialised function in church governance. Because the title of monsignor historically designated a priest who served in the papal curia, all nominated Monsignors are officially considered part of the papal household, whether they serve in the Vatican or elsewhere. In scaling back honorific positions within the Catholic Church in 2014 Pope Francis retained the category of "Chaplain to His Holiness" for any and all new nominated recipients. In keeping with Pope Francis' reforms a "Chaplain to His Holiness" is only granted to a diocesan priest who is over 65 years of age.
