Ordinary Time - Father Richard Veras -

In his homily at my priestly ordination, Cardinal John J. O'Connor told my classmates and me, "The greatest homily that could be preached to you about your priesthood does not come from me, but from these priests and bishops who are here in this sanctuary. . . You will find them weak at times, tempered at times, even sinful at times; you and others may rant or rave about their inabilities or their lack of zeal, but these brothers of yours have *never given up*." It was a beautiful testament to the grace of perseverance in one's vocation, which is the grace of Christ persevering with us and bearing fruit in those who humbly accept his graces. The cardinal told us to seek Christ in the Eucharist and in the gift of the Holy Spirit in times of discouragement.

As we depart from the Christmas Season and enter again into Ordinary Time, let us recall that Jesus promises to be with us, not just in privileged moments like Christmas Day, or the Wedding Day or Ordination Day. He promises to be with us *always*.

Most of Jesus' life, from infancy to twelve and from twelve to thirty, was seemingly ordinary, as witnessed by neighbours who hear him preach and say, *isn't this the carpenter's son?*

As we move from Christmas into the ordinary, let us not forget that Jesus continues to walk with us in the daily routine of life which he has sanctified, and continues to sanctify, with his abiding presence.

Who Is My Neighbour?

I have worked for decades in the academy and in the Church on issues touching the family, at the intersection of Church and state. During those same decades I have married, borne children, miscarried children, counselled adult children about relationships, and shared life in a large extended family.

Were I to participate only in my professional world, I might succumb to the temptation of believing the usual accusation: "Why don't you Catholics stop talking about private, strictly emotional choices and concentrate solely on issues that really matter to people, like poverty or immigration or the environment?" As a wife and mother and little cog in a big family, though, I know better. And it's not only because Catholics are immersed up to their eyebrows in each of these matters. It's also because I have come to understand that, like me, the vast majority of people affect other people in society – for good or ill, deeply, and for their entire lives – by way of family choices more than other choices.

By dating in ways that prepare both people for a long and loving marriage. By bringing children into the world to best assure them stable, generous access to both parents. By showing children that the martial "unity of the two" that the world increasingly believes is impossible is possible. These choices reverberate down the generations. So do their opposites. Family life strews "nearest neighbours" on our path, and demands we act the Good Samaritan every single day.
