## (Season of Creation 2) Gospel: Luke 15:1-32 Coming to our senses

In the parable about the lost sheep and the lost coin, we hear how God celebrates when those who stray are returned to the community. In the third parable about the lost son, we hear that the youngest brother eventually 'came to himself' or came to his senses as we might say. By entering into greater awareness, he realized that he had made wrong choices and had a change of heart. We might focus today on how we too must come to our senses in our lives, especially during this Season of Creation.

We lament the destruction of God's creation and the loss of biodiversity that is due to human activity, God's creatures are disappearing from the Earth at a rate we can scarcely comprehend. In 2020 the *Living Planet Report* concluded that 68% of wildlife had disappeared in the period from 1970 to 2016. We are living through the sixth mass extinction of life in our planet's history, and this one is being driven by human overconsumption. For example, by destroying our great rainforests we destroy not only trees, but also the habitats of birds, insects, mammals and plants which will never be seen again. Pope Francis invites us to 'feel the desertification of the soil almost as a physical ailment and the extinction of a species as a painful disfigurement' (Laudato Si' §89). We are part of, and dependent on, complex and delicate ecosystems which make up the web of life. This web is now unravelling, and we know that we humans cannot be healthy on a planet that is itself unhealthy.

The enormity of this crisis threatens to overwhelm us. Yet, hope is found in action. Like the lost son in today's Gospel, we are capable of coming to our senses, choosing again what is good, and making a new start. As with all significant changes, this begins at the grassroots – with you and me.
