#### THIRTY FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME Deacon Liam Dunne

Gospel: Luke 19:1-10 Salvation to this house

The story of Zacchaeus is one of the most familiar Gospel stories, although it is only found in Luke. The vivid details resonate with us: the unpopular tax collector, too short to see Jesus, who climbs a tree to get a better view, and then hears the startling words of Jesus, 'Zaccheaus, hurry and come down; for I must stay at your home today'. As he often does, Jesus goes against the social and religious expectations of his time. As a tax collector, Zacchaeus would have been considered an outsider, in this scene he is also literally on the outside of the crowd. He can't get a glimpse of Jesus, but in his determination to see him he climbs a tree.

Jesus sees Zacchaeus, however, and approached him, creating shock among the onlookers. They grumble, unhappy to see Jesus reaching out to a *'sinner'*. Then Jesus does something completely unexpected. He invites himself to Zacchaeus home, where Jesus' pronouncement is equally unexpected, 'Today, salvation has come to this house'. This story ties in perfectly with the earlier parables of the Lost Coin, the Lost Sheep and the Prodigal Son (Lk 15:1-32). There we are reminded of the rejoicing that takes place when what has been lost is found again. Jesus has come to save the lost.

In this story, it is significant that Jesus invites Zacchaeus into table-fellowship, even before he decided to mend his ways and make restitution to those he had cheated. Zacchaeus welcomes Jesus to his house with open arms, and the experience of Jesus' love and acceptance transforms him. ### Norms for Indulgences at the Commemoration of All Souls

1. From twelve o'clock noon on 1st November until midnight on 2nd November, all who have confessed, received Holy Communion and prayed for the pope's intentions (one Our Father and Hail Mary, or any other prayer of one's choice) can gain one plenary indulgence by visiting a church or oratory, and there reciting one Our Father and the Apostle's Creed. This indulgence is applicable only to the souls of the departed. Confession may be made at any time within the week preceding or the week following 1st November. Holy Communion may be received on any day from 1st – 8th November. 2. The faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead may gain a plenary indulgence applicable only to the Holy Souls on the usual conditions once per day from 1st – 8th November. The conditions mentioned above apply also for this.

### What are indulgences?

Indulgences are the remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. The faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains the indulgence under prescribed conditions for either himself or the departed. Indulgences are granted through the ministry of the Church which, as the dispenser of the grace of redemption, distributes the treasury of the merits of Christ and the Saints. See CCC, 1471-9, 1498.
