THE BAPTISM OF JESUS

Matthew 3:13-17 The Great Turning

Full of conviction, passion and righteous anger, John the Baptist pleads with people to turn around and 'prepare the way' (3:3). Yet, in today's Gospel we meet a different John. He is surprised to see that Jesus has arrived to be baptized by him and feels unworthy of such a task. Jesus explains to John that this is a necessary signal at the beginning of his ministry, a public statement of identity. It is also more than that. In Jesus' first spoken words in Matthew's Gospel, he says this baptism is 'to fulfil all righteousness', and here we have the central theme of Matthew's Gospel announced. In the Old Testament, 'righteousness' literally means "right relationship". It is not solely focused on an individual's repentance but refers to the turning around of God' people, a collective turning towards restoration and justice across the land. Jesus at the Jordan stands with God's people, in solidarity yes, but also in his full human experience, in his living, suffering, dying, and in the making of straighter paths. Jesus is baptized in the Jordan, because he is modelling the way for humanity as we strive for 'righteousness' in our communities and in the complexities that life brings for each of us. We are not short of situations in our world which require people to turn around and walk a new path. The environmental crisis is one example, calling the entire human species to wake up and walk an entirely different path in order to ensure a sustainable future for all. This requires a *collective turning*, what authors Joanna Macey and Chris Johnson call 'The Great Turning'. They describe our current situation as one where we are living through three realities at once: 'Business as Usual' (measuring progress by economic growth), 'The Great Unravelling, (the destruction of our only home in order to achieve economic growth), and 'The Great Turning'. This Great Turning is the global awakening, the ecological revolution that is underway and which must be fully embraced if we are to bring healing to our world.

This week's Special edition remembers the life of the late Pope Emeritus Benedict.

POPE BENEDICT XVI born Joseph Aloisius Ratzinger; 16 April 1927 – 31 December 2022) was the head of the Catholic Church and sovereign of the Vatican City State from 19 April 2005 until his resignation on 28 February 2013. Benedict's election as pope occurred in the 2005 papal conclave that followed the death of Pope John Paul II. Benedict chose to be known as "Pope emeritus" upon his resignation, and he retained this title until his death in 2022.

On 11 February 2013, Benedict announced his resignation, citing a "lack of strength of mind and body" due to his advanced age. His resignation was the first by a pope since Gregory XII in 1415, and the first on a pope's initiative since Celestine V in 1294. He was succeeded by Francis on 13 March 2013 and moved into the newly renovated Mater Ecclesiae Monastery in Vatican City for his retirement. May he Rest in Peace.

A MESSAGE FROM AN GARDA SIOCHANA

An Garda Siochana wish to warn people of a doorstep fraud and theft offence which has become prevalent over the last number of weeks.

Elderly People are being targeted at their homes by Criminals who are impersonating Gardaí. The offenders are fraudulently pretending to be plain clothes Gardaí who are checking for dud money. They have duped people all around the country and stolen their cash on the pretence of checking to see if it is genuine money. They are producing false identification to assist the process.

Advice:

An Garda Siochana will never ask people about their finances on the doorstep of their homes and will never ask to check money.

Always ask for Identification and do not be afraid to question it. If in doubt politely tell the caller that you want to verify their true identity. If necessary contact your local Garda Station who will be able to establish quickly if the caller is a member of An Garda Siochana.

Report any such activity to your local Garda Station even if you have not been the victim of a theft. That report could save a neighbour or someone else close by.

Please check on elderly neighbours, family and friends and advise and reassure them.
