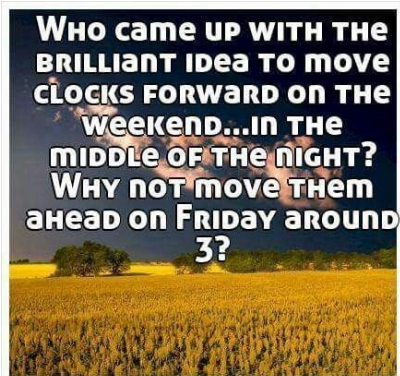

EASTER CHEESECAKE

Ingredients

vegetable oil, for the tin
200g digestive biscuits
80g butter melted
250g chocolate mini eggs or leftover Easter eggs
400g full-fat soft cheese
150g icing sugar
1 tsp vanilla
400g double cream

Method

Oil a 20cm deep springform cake tin and line with baking parchment. Tip the digestive biscuits into a food bag or the bowl of a food processor and crush or blitz to a fine crumb. Mix with the melted butter, then press into the base of the prepared cake tin and chill for 30 mins.

Roughly chop half the chocolate mini eggs. Beat the soft cheese with the icing sugar and vanilla until just combined using an electric whisk. Clean the beaters, then beat the double cream to stiff peaks in a separate bowl. Gently fold the whipped cream into the soft cheese mixture along with the chopped chocolate mini eggs. Spoon the cheesecake mixture over the biscuit base, then smooth the surface with a palette knife or spatula. Chill overnight.

The next day, carefully release the cheesecake from the tin (you may need to run a cutlery knife around the edge to loosen it) and top with the remaining whole chocolate mini eggs to decorate.

Looking back to Kiltegan Camogie 1971

The first victory the team recorded was on the 26th July, when they defeated Aughrim in Aughrim in the league. Kiltegan 5-0 Aughrim 1-0. Our scores came from Ann Rafferty 2-0, Ann Lawlor 2-0, Marion Roach 1-0, Marion was from Knockananna and was a shop assistant in Culbert's shop.

The panel that year was Lily Gillespie, Ann Lawlor, Bernie O' Brine, Borkle, Marie Clynch, Bernie Brophy, Mary Foley, Tynock, Una Dowling, Mary Lawlor, Bridget Mc Donald, Ann Rafferty, others to play between 1971 and 1972 were Mary Cash, the Crowley sisters, Flynn sisters, Brusselstown, Mary Donegan, Tynock, Norah Murry, Baltinglass, Mary Kelly, Fauna, Donard, Pauline Hourigan, Ann Grant Byrne, Angela Rafferty, Patrica Clynch, Carmel Mc Coy, Mary & Breda Cremin and Mary Germain.

The Club also fielded a team in 1971 in the under 17 County Championship and defeated Knockananna by 3-1 to 2-0 on the 30th October 1971. Scorers on the day were Ann Rafferty 2-0, Ann Somers 1-0, Mary Lawlor 0-1, others mentioned in a brief report were Una Dowling, Rosaria Brophy, Josie Norton. Those were the only two wins recorded that year and everyone was looking forward to 1972 and how this young club would preform.
