John 20:1-9 Dare to hope

The empty tomb causes consternation. In John's account, Mary Magdalene, the first to arrive, is confused by the missing stone. 'They have taken the Lord.' Peter and John see the empty tomb and wrappings, but appear not to understand. Only when John enters the tomb does he 'see and believe'. Mary Magdalene will be the first to see the Risen Jesus, recognizing him when he calls her by name. Later, Thomas will be convinced only when he sees and touches Jesus. The Good News dawns gradually for the disciples. We share in their awe and excitement this morning. Jesus is alive! We enter into the mystery, allowing ourselves to believe and to hope.

You may have heard the expression 'the audacity of hope'. It became famous as the title of Barack Obama's autobiography, but it originated in a sermon by pastor Jeremiah Wright in which he reflected on the G. F. Watts painting, 'Hope'. In the painting, a female figure sits, blindfolded playing a lyre that has only one string. With her clothes in rags, her body scarred and bruised and bleeding, her harp all but destroyed and with only one spring left, she had the audacity to make music and praise God. ... To take the one string you have left and to have the audacity to hope that's the real word God will have us hear.' The mystery of the Resurrection is that we can dare to hope. God has made all things new.

The Resurrection completes what Jesus began. The Resurrection of Jesus, who was persecuted, suffered and died, is God's affirmation that victory does not rest with the world's victors, but with its victims, Jesus' words and deeds are risen and exalted too. The Jesus who is raised is the one who sides with the poor, the mistreated, the ignored; who challenges the status quo and tells us 'The last will be first'. We are challenged to model our lives on this vision of Jesus, to shine light into the darkness and bring hope to an uncertain world.
