<u>11th Sunday in Ordinary Time</u> Deacon Rev. Liam Dunne <u>Matthew</u> 9:36-10:8 Signs of life

Pope Francis's annual pre-Christmas address to Vatican cardinals has become something of a hit. He is not shy of naming truths that might be hard to hear. During the 2015 address, Pope Francis criticised those who were trying to block reform in the Church and said that changes at the Vatican should be seen first and foremost as a sign of life. The Church needs reform 'because she is alive'. Pope Francis does this from a place of love, as a pastor who has genuine care for people, for the Gospel message and for our common home.

In the Gospel today we hear that Jesus has deep compassion for his people, because they are like 'sheep without a shepherd'; with no real spiritual leadership or mentors to guide them they cannot grow in their faith or reach their full potential. The religious and political leaders who are meant to care for their well-being have instead oppressed and exploited them. So when Jesus sends out the Twelve Disciples he sends them first to 'the lost sheep of the house of Israel', to the people, yes, but also to the religious leaders of his day. Jesus was a radical reformer, who was concerned at this point not with setting up a new religion but with transforming his own faith community.

Where reform is concerned, there will always be obstacles. These obstacles usually come from within, because reform involves [change] letting go of what no longer serves. The ego finds this difficult. Individually and institutionally, we are in need of conversion and transformation. Conversion enables us to be authentic to the inclusive, communal, and universal message of Jesus. It allows us to deepen and nourish a more authentic spirituality. Today many people are (re)discovering the wisdom traditions in Christianity, turning towards the mystics, returning to practices like Lectio Divina, embracing contemplations and silence, recommencing with treasures we have forgotten (Mt 13) or perhaps were never taught. It is one of the signs that we live in a time of great change and that holding on to that which no longer serves will not help.
