#### *Matthew 18:21-35* Turning around

We continue to read from Matthew 18 on the virtues that are essential for the Christian community, and today's parable deals with forgiveness. Peter is told to forgive seventy times seven, a number which represents infinity, that is, endless forgiveness. God's grace and mercy is abundant, and we are called to extend that grace and mercy to others. The vision which is unfolding in Matthew's Gospel emphasises restoring relationships and wholeness within the community and this usually involves a change in perspective. As Christian communities today, we are certainty faced with a new question: what does restoration and wholeness look like in an era of ecological breakdown?

During this Season of Creation can we admit to ourselves that our relationship with God's creation is fractured? Coming into this awareness is a painful process. It means awakening to the realities of the loss of biodiversity, the fact that we are spewing millions of tons of harmful greenhouse gases into the thin shell of our atmosphere, the destruction of the great forests, the pollution of our oceans and rivers with plastic, the degradation of the soil and wetlands, our 'throwaway culture'. All of these things cause us great distress, and we feel it on a level that we are not even aware of. Our *turning around* begins by sitting in this painful awareness of what is and, like the slaves in the parable today who 'saw what had happened' and 'were greatly distressed', we are called to respond to what we see. Beginning to *see* the need for reconciliation with God, with our sisters and brothers who are suffering, and with creation which cries out to us is the first step on this journey of ecological conversion. "For we know that things can change" (*Laudato Si'*, 13).

- Come into awareness: ask for the grace to see creation as God does in all its splendour and in all suffering. Do you see the beauty of creation and hear the cry of the earth and the poor?
- ♦ Ask for the gift of conversion: where have I fallen short in caring for creation? Ask for the grace of a conversion of the heart.
- \* Reconciliation: how might I reconcile this relationship with God, creation and humanity? Can I stand in solidarity through my action and make choices consistent with my desire for reconciliation with creation?
- ♦ Offer a closing prayer for the earth and those now suffering the effects of climate change and biodiversity loss.

#### CLIMATE ACTION AT CARLOW COUNTY COUNCIL.

Carlow County Council has recently appointed a Community Climate Action Officer to roll out a funding stream to Community Groups under the Community Climate Action Programme. The aim of this programme is to support and empower local groups build low carbon communities in a planned way and contribute to national climate and energy targets. Funding supports will be targeted at a range of different projects, from small projects under €20,000 up to a maximum of €100,000 for large projects.
