# 22<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary TimeDeacon Rev. Liam DunneMatthew 16:21-27Selfless love

The narrative today marks a turning point in Matthew's Gospel as we hear the first of three predictions in the Gospel concerning Jesus' death and resurrection (17:22 23; 17-19). Given the political climate at the time, and the fate of prophets and leaders before him, it is not a stretch to say that Jesus is fully aware of the consequences he faces. But this would be too much for the disciples, incomprehensible that the long-awaited Messiah could be crucified and die. Peter is understandably upset by this thought, he probably still had notions of a political Messiah who would reign as a mighty king and overthrow the Roman occupiers. Peter has gone in a few short verses from being the 'rock' with divinely inspired insights, to being a 'stumbling block' on Jesus' path. Following Jesus means following a path that world will not understand.

Jesus died because if you love in the way that Jesus loved and loves, the world will most certainly try to crush you. This is 'agape' love, a selfless love for people regardless of who they are or their circumstances. We remember today those who have followed Jesus' path, speaking out against oppressive systems, seeking justice for those on the margins, often when it is dangerous to do so. On example is St Oscar Romero, the former Archbishop of El Salvador, who was assassinated in 1980 for speaking out against the Human Rights violations in his country. He famously said, "I do not believe in death without resurrection. If they do kill me, I will rise again in the people of El Salvador." People like Archbishop Romero put on 'the mind of Christ', selflessly giving of themselves for their communities, pouring out love, demanding truth and justice for those who are helpless. The Cross is a symbol of much suffering in our world, but it is also a symbol of liberation, because it is through the Cross that restoration and healing comes. # **SEASON OF CREATION**

# TREASURE IRELAND

A new video series launched recently by the Irish Dominicans is an ambitious project that will take the friars to every county in Ireland, filming roughly ten videos in each county, highlighting the many and varied stories that make up the history of Irish Christianity.

The series is currently focussed on the counties which overlap with the territory of the diocese of Kildare and Leighlin: Laois, Kildare, Carlow, and Kilkenny. Some of the sites visited include Timahoe, the Rock of Dunamase, and the Brownshill Dolmen. The story of Jesuit photographer, Fr Frank Browne, is told in a video recorded in Emo Court, and that of pioneering scientist, Fr Nicholas Callan, in a video from Maynooth.

The stories of the great saints of these counties feature prominently: there are videos on St Brigid, St Mochua, St Moling, St Fergal of Aghaboe, and the Dominican martyr, Blessed Peter O'Higgins. There'll soon be added to that list the stories of two great bishops of Kildare and Leighlin: Daniel Delany (d. 1814) and James Doyle (d. 1834), also known as J.K.L. ('James of Kildare and Leighlin'). All of these stories are told in a way designed to interest believers and non-believers alike, showing, bit by bit, that the Gospel is woven inseparably into the fabric of Irish history.
