Season of Creation 4 Matthew 21:28-32 Walking the talk

Jesus and the disciples have entered Jerusalem and the conflict that has been building with the religious leaders is reaching its climax. Jesus has cleared the moneychangers out of the Temple; healed people inside the Temple, the children are crying out 'hosanna to the Son of David', and this chaotic scene is just all too much for the chief priests. Who does this guy think he is? Then, Jesus teaches the parable of the two sons, which is a lesson for the religious leaders against hypocrisy. This parable, unique to Matthew, reaffirms a great upheaval; those considered to be on the fringes of society are the ones who respond to Jesus' message, yet those who say the right thing do not walk-the-talk.

In Laudato Si' Pope Francis criticises the failure of global summits to take the urgent action that is needed on the environmental crisis. He says, "recent World Summits on the environment have not lived up to expectations because, due to lack of political will, they were unable to reach truly meaningful and effective global agreements on the environment." (Laudato Si', 166). This is in spite of devastating climate and biodiversity disasters worldwide and annual UN scientific reports that continue to sound the alarm bells and call our present situation a "code red for humanity".

While world leaders are not walking-the-talk, it is clear that there is a swelling of grassroots activists who speak truth to power and who are taking action on the environmental crisis in their own backyards and local communities. One such person is Dr Rajwant Singh, who funded Eco-Sikh, an organisation in India aiming to plant one million trees by 2030. They are already half way to their target simply by asking each Sikh community in their region to plant 550 trees per community, a very doable task. Millions of people around the world are walking-the-talk at the grassroots, helping to heal our common home, cleansing this Temple. With over 220,000 Catholic parishes in the world, imagine what we could achieve if each parish community put their mind to it.
