Matthew 22:34-40

The lens of love

The religious elite continue their attempts to discredit Jesus as he teaches in the Temple; they try to trick him by asking which of the laws of Judaism are the most important. Jesus responds by quoting Deuteronomy 6:5 and Leviticus 19:18: 'love the Lord your God ... love your neighbour as yourself'. All other laws 'hang' on these two; they are the lens through which all else is to be interpreted. This Wisdom saying can sometimes be dismissed as sentimentality, but here Jesus is speaking a deep truth. Both commandments are interconnected, 'like' one another, and their foundation is to love God with our entire being, 'heart ... soul and ... mind'. That means sitting with the truth that God is love and dwells within each person; this is our true self (1Cor 3:16). This brings the question, can we cope with this? Are we able to open our hearts in awareness to this love, to tap into this divine indwelling? Then we can truly love our neighbour as ourselves – not as much as ourselves, but as a complete continuation of our very being. Thomas Keating once said, 'We're all like localised vibrations of the infinite goodness of God's presence. So love is our very nature. Love is our first, middle, and last name.'

In Matthew chapter 18, we read what this love of neighbour involves: bringing restoration to the community, solving disputes, forgiving one another ... serving others. This is a lifelong task, and we cannot do it alone. Cultivating a deep awareness of the Source of this love that dwells within, in turn allows this love to flow outward. This love invites us to open our hearts fully to the Divine, to reject individualism and embrace a radical solidarity with our fellow human beings and with all creation. The religious leaders dare not ask Jesus any more questions (22:46); they have been 'amazed' (v. 22), 'astounded' (v. 33) and 'silenced' (v. 34).
