Feast of Christ the KingDeacon: Rev. Liam DunneLast Sunday in Ordinary TimeMatthew 25:31-46Namaste

We have arrived at the final Sunday in the Liturgical Calendar and this Feast of Christ the King brings our journey with Matthew's Gospel to a close, for now. Instead of palaces or trappings, today we have Christ the King found dwelling with those who are on the fringes of society: prisoners, the hungry, the naked. How transformative it would be to really see God present in each other and in those that society considers the 'least'. There is a beautiful practice in India of using the phrase '*Namaste*' when you greet someone, which literally means, the Divine in me greets the Divine in you. Usually this greeting is accompanied by a deep bow towards the other person. Words are one thing, but can we live this? At the heart of the mystery of today's Gospel is the radical call to *be* Christ to others and to *see* Christ in others.

Acts of love, mercy and compassion towards the 'least' in the community are a summary of Jesus' ministry in Matthew's Gospel, keys to the Kingdom of Heaven. Jesus is never afraid to call out good and evil, and while this might make us uncomfortable, it presents us with the opportunity to go deeper, to recognise the weeds and the wheat, the sheep and the goats in our world but also within ourselves. We are called to him by giving our lives in service to those around, recognising Christ in those we meet and within ourselves. All are sacred. This is 'Good News', even the righteous in the parable today are surprised to the recognised (v. 37). The call is to contemplative action, and there should be no half measure as we have seen in the previous parables: stay alert, use our gifts and talents, keep the lamps lit.

To really live this, to love God who dwells within, through loving our neighbour who is Christ to us; is to be true to the greatest commandment.
