# <u>4<sup>th</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME</u> Mark 1:21-28

# Deacon: Rev. Liam Dunne **The Holy One of God**

Jesus begins his ministry in Capernaum, a prosperous town on the northwestern side of the Sea of Galilee, the centre of Jesus' Galilean ministry and also his home (2:1). In the synagogue on the sabbath, Jesus teaches 'as one who had authority' and the people are 'astonished' by him, a reaction we will see frequently in Mark. The word used here for 'authority' is *exousia*, a word that was usually applied to kings and was associated with what God would do when God's Kingdom came. Unclean spirits or 'demons' in Jesus' time offered an explanation for physical or psychological illness, but having an 'unclean spirit' was a phrase also used to describe someone who was opposed to that which was considered 'holy'. Whatever the issue is here this man has no business being in the synagogue; he was considered ritually unclean, and this was a sacred place. There is an irony throughout Mark's Gospel in that it is the 'demons' and not the disciples who speak the truth about Jesus: 'I know who you are, the Holy One of God.' While this man speaks the truth, it is also an example of how it is not enough to know a thing. You can know the truth and still be opposed to it if it doesn't suit your agenda. The real example of faith involves trusting with the heart and responding with action and truth. The demons are unable to do this. Jesus responds quite bluntly to 'the unclean spirit', literally telling it to 'Shut up' or 'Be muzzled'.

There are many 'demons' in our world that need to be cast out – racism, discrimination of all kinds, greed, inequality, self-centredness. One message from the narrative today is that it is not enough to know a thing, you can *know* that Jesus is the Holy One of God, but faith is a way of living, not just believing. Jesus is the one who comes to restore and to liberate – his 'authority' is recognised through his healing action and service, a sign of the closeness of God's Kingdom. This is why the 'unclean spirit' cries out as it leaves – the game is up, it no longer has any power.
