2nd Sunday of Lent

Deacon: Rev. Liam Dunne Mark 9:2-10 Listen to him

Today's Gospel is from a carefully constructed centre of Mark's Gospel (8:22 - 10:52). It is no coincidence that Mark framed this section with the healing of two blind men (8:22; 10:46). Peter knows that Jesus is the Messiah but he does not grasp the full picture (8:32 8), a bit like the man who partially regains his sight but cannot see clearly (8:24). The Transfiguration is a very significant moment for the disciples, an attempt by Jesus to cure the spiritual blindness of this close inner circle, so that they might see Jesus' true identity. While the English translation says that Jesus was 'transfigured', the Greek verb metamorphothe (metamorphosis) is used. The disciples literally witness Jesus' bodily form changing and they hear a voice from heaven: 'This is my beloved Son; listen to him.' Understandably, they 'were terrified'. Jesus' clothes are described as dazzling white. Mystics throughout the centuries describe experiences of such light, what the Orthodox mystics call 'the Uncreated Light'. We also find such descriptions of such light in the Scriptures when referring to a direct encounter with God or when a person's inner self is displayed. In a mixture of awe and panic Peter offers to build tents, afraid to lose the mystical moment. While we can understand his motivation, Peter still doesn't get it, his vision is blurred. The disciples must come down from the mountaintop, because Jesus' way involves walking a path that will not be so easy, a path that leads to the cross. A disciple must replicate the life of the one they follow, a choice that they must make continuously - to come down from the mountain and engage with the suffering of the world.

The disciples have caught a glimpse of the Divine, and no doubt this will give them strength for walking the difficult road ahead. These glimpses are not beyond us if only we see through a lens that is more deeply aware of Christ's presence in the world. VOCATIONS WEBINAR

There is a webinar on Vocations taking place on Tuesday 5th March from 8-9pm. The Webinar is hosted by 'The Hook of Faith' platform (<u>www.thehookoffaith.com</u>) and is organised in collaboration with the National Vocations Office. The webinar is entitled '*The Last Priest in Ireland? It Depends on You*'. It is a follow up of a RTE documentary broadcast in January entitled '*The Last Priest in Ireland*'. The keynote speaker will be Breda O'Brien. There will be a panel of responders. The webinar is a Church response to the programme and an opportunity for dialogue about the future of vocations to the priesthood in Ireland. The initiative is part of the year of prayer and promotion to the diocesan priesthood 'Take the Risk for Christ'.

UISCE FOR TANZANIA

Your donations meant that UISCE FOR TANZANIA provided 2,500 villagers and their farm animals with a permanent water supply in 2023.

This project, the first for UFT, was a great success. Jim Kavanagh was on site for the duration of the project, arranging the purchase of materials and organising the local men who willingly dug trenches for water pipes, carted materials over difficult land, doing all without payment. The knowledge that they were helping their own community was sufficient reward. Your donations have meant that this community in the Mbulu District of North Western Tanzania now has life-long water at a cost of about €14 per person. Your money has been well used.

2024 will see UFT back in the Mbulu District, where a similar project has already been identified. This time the water supply has been found and once harnessed and brought to the community it will serve a school of 600 pupils, a clinic used by the Mothers and children and a wide rural population. This project will also require money to be raised in Ireland. Thanks to your generosity in 2023 we have some funds in place but this will need to be topped up in the next few months.
