Mark 1:29-39 Now is the time

The pace of this opening of Mark's Gospel can leave us breathless. We might notice Mark's tendency to speak in totalities – 'all who are sick' are brought to Jesus, 'the whole city' is gathered around the door, 'everyone' is searching for Jesus. The language conveys the momentum of his ministry. Jesus comes into situations of suffering and brings instant healing and hope. We see this with Simon's mother-in-law, whose immediate response to Jesus 'lifting her up' is to serve. There is a sense of hurry; the time has come, the Kingdom of God is near (1:15). At the end of today's Gospel Jesus is on the move again – 'Let us go to the neighbouring towns'. There is no time to waste!

More than fifty years ago, in his historic 'I Have a Dream' speech, Martin Luther King Jr made an urgent and passionate appeal for racial and social justice: "We are now faced with the fact that tomorrow is today. We are confronted with the fierce urgency of now. In this unfolding conundrum of life and history, there 'is' such a thing as being too late. This is no time for apathy or complacency. This is a time for vigorous and positive action." His call to action confronts us still as racism, hatred and violence continues to cause great suffering to communities of colour. We are summoned to respond with the 'fierce urgency' that grips Jesus and the disciples in today's Gospel, and which inspired Dr King to call people to dream of a better world and to advance this dream together. We are challenged to see the world in a new way: for every person suffering in our world, there is the 'fierce urgency of now'.
