John 15:9-17 No greater love

Today's Gospel offers one of the most eloquent passages on love in the Gospels. It reveals the vision of Jesus for his followers: that we love one another with the same love Jesus showed during his time on earth, the selfless and generous love that culminated in his 'laying down his life for his friends'.

In 2012 Global Witness started reporting on the killings of land and environmental defenders. Since then, they have recorded the number of 1,733 defenders who have been killed trying to protect their land and resources; that's an average of one defender killed approximately every two days. Berta Caceres was shot dead in 2016 after a long battle to try to stop the construction of a hydroelectric dam on the Gualcarque River. This river is considered sacred to the indigenous Lenca communities in western Honduras. Berta was shot for leading this campaign in defence of the environment and human rights. Her community say's 'she is present in the soul of our rivers and the spirit of our birds'. Her daughter, Bertita Zunga Caceres, continues the struggle and says, 'I believe that we deserve a life of justice, freedom and peace ... We want a country that recognises indigenous people and the diversities that make up Honduras – a country built according to Honduran needs and not those of companies.'

As we reflect on the words of Jesus today, we remember people like Berta who are witnesses of unconditional love, standing up for those in need of protection. Such people are living Jesus' words deeply: No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends.' This is at the heart of Jesus' teaching and life. We are called to take these words to heart, to let them form our attitudes towards others and our actions in the world. The love shown by Jesus is the same generous, wholehearted, self-sacrificing love we are called to show others – all others. Those who persevere and work tirelessly for their families, communities and those on the margins are models for us all.
