Looking Back 50 Years of Juvenile Hurling 1975.

After the success of winning the Lee Cup by the boys from Tynock & Talbotstown schools managed by the late Peter Keogh and his lone selector John Timmins. The success of winning this cup saw a big drive to promote juvenile hurling in the Kiltegan and West Wicklow with our club leading the way. At this time the infant club found a great friend and patron in Arklow born priest Fr. Liam Dunne brother of Jimmy Dunne who was ministering in Castlecomer, Co Kilkenny, a trip to the famous county for under 12 & 14 teams was organised with the travelling party selected from every one of the schools that had taken part in the first Lee Cup. The bulk of the players coming from Kiltegan area. Many trips to other hurling counties was organised by Peter Keogh and his helpers, Sean O'Sullivan a teacher in Vallymount and Barney Keogh of Hollywood. An under 12 & 14 team was entered in the Wicklow Championships for the first time under the name Kiltegan. A set of red and white iersevs were bought along with hurlers and hurling balls. Training sessions were held weekly, mostly in Kiltegan and all the trips to Kilkenny, Carlow and other venues paid off as our under 12's went all the way and won the first ever County Juvenile title to come to the West. Our under 14 team made it to the county final but were beaten by a much more experienced Carnew team. Team John Byrne. Andy Coleman, Seamus Mc Donald, Sean Byrne, Sean O'Sullivan, Tom Donoghue, Peter Foley, John Murphy, Ned Cremin, Garret Byrne, Kevin Byrne, Pat Donegan, Sean Gartland, Seamus O'Keeffe, John Halpin, Hugh Cullen, Pat Mahon, Seamus Farrell.

Finding matches for these teams and finding volunteers to help out was a big problem. As there was no county league we entered a team in the Community Games in Wicklow and against all odds we were crowned county champions with out even pucking a ball. This was due to walk over from Bray and Ashford which we only found out about after traveling to each venue. There was no What's App group back then. We went on to represent Wicklow in the Leinster Community Games drawn against Newbridge of Kildare. Peter Keogh had recruited a couple of players from Baltinglass Con Murphy. Robert Mc Hugh, unfortunately Con got injured while playing for Wicklow County team and was not able to play for us. On the morning of the match the full team was loaded into three cars and driven to Newbridge for the game, Peter Keogh, John Timmins and Ned Cremin along with one supporter Mrs Breda Cremin. The boys put in a great display and came away with a draw. John Murphy, Martin Dowling (RIP) controlled mid field. Tom Cremin was great in defence with Kevin Byrne. Ned Cremin was our leading scorer. John Keogh, Joseph Shortall Robert McHugh also had an excellent game. The replay was fixed for the following week in Baltinglass GAA grounds unfortunately we lost as Newbridge had bought two girls with them, this was unheard of at the time, girls playing on a boys under 14 team. They proved to be their winning asset, as our lads did not want to mark them and there was a bit of a stand off for a while until someone guipped "In a few years time they would be looking for their phone numbers". The two girls held their own against our lads and maybe this is why they won this game. So ended a great first year for our juvenile hurling team.
