

1978 Looking Back to '78: 1978

In 1978, the dark days of hurling in the club were back again when we played only 4 adult games, 3 in Senior & 1 in Junior. We played no matches in the hurling league & beat Shillelagh 2-3 to 1-1 in the 1st rd of the Senior Championship. We lost to Avondale in the next round 1-9 to 1-10. Then we entered the losers group in the Championship & lost to a St. Patrick's/Baraderry combination group 2-7 to 1-9. We lost a lot of our Junior hurlers to the Senior team & were unable to field a team in the Jnr Hurling Championship. We played 1 game in the West Junior hurling League Final against Kilbride & lost 0-6 to 2-1. Our U21 team also withdrew from the championship. So it ended- Hurling in the club for this year the juvenile club were flying & keeping hurling alive in the club. At their AGM held in Rathcoole NS, the following were elected: **Chairperson** Mrs. Anne Byrne, **Secretary** Brian Graham, **Treasurer** Mrs. Rose Byrne, **PRO** Peter Keogh, **Captains**: U12s PJ Byrne / Peter Byrne, **U14s** Hugh Cullen / Andy Coleman, **U16s** Gareth Byrne / Ned Cremin, **Lee Cup**, **Rathcoole**, Esther Byrne / Pat Gartland, **Tynock** Pat Byrne / Des Foley. Team of the Year was the U14 hurlers. They won the County championship for the 1st time ever. Then added the County Feile Na Gall title to their belt & would represent our County, Wicklow, for the 1st time in the National All-Ireland competition in Kilkenny. The County Feile brought new & exciting opportunities. Funds were low in the club, so a cabaret was organised for the Talk of the Town, this raised £100, which was a lot of money at the time. Mrs. Higginson of Bortle made & designed a beautiful new club banner. Even the parade was rehearsed in the Village a week before the big event. No bus was hired, everyone travelled at their own expense. No video at the time, but Danny Byrne recorded the whole event on a 16mm Movil camera. New standards were set & met by the club + players. While they did not bring home any silverware, they brought home memories, never to be forgotten. They done the County and Club proud.

The team was hosted by Tullaroan Club in Kilkenny. They beat Avoca in the Championship 2-3 to 2-2. And in the Feile final, 1-1 to 1-0. **Team**: Hugh Cullen-Captain, Pat Gartland, Tom Cremin, Kieran O'Keefe, Seamus Farrell, Mick Byrne, John Byrne, PJ Byrne, Andy Coleman, John Red Byrne, Declan Byrne, Ken Foley, Kevin Byrne, Hugh Harmon, Thomas Whelan, Seamus O'Keefe, Declan Carroll & Peter Byrne. The U12 hurling team retained the O'Reilly Cup West Championship for the fourth year in a row and were beaten by Avoca in the County final for the first time in four years by 3-0 to 1-0. The U16 team reached the County final for the first time, but was to be beaten by Avoca 5-5 to 1-1. In football, the club scored another first when they won the Teachers' Cup, beating Blessington in the final 3-1 to 2-3. The record-breaking year ended with a visit by Tullaroan Club Kilkenny, to Kiltegan, when they brought their U12 and U14 team to play a match, they held us in such high esteem. We lost both matches, but their visit was worthwhile and ended a great year for the club.



County Teams News:

Again, mixed fortunes for the County teams in their various league matches at the weekend. The County football team lost to neighbours Carlow. Our player, Podge O'Toole, had an excellent game, scoring two goals.



The County hurling team got their League Campaign back on track with a big win over Armagh. Our players, Brian Kearney, at full-back, played well. Seán Germaine 1-2, sub Brandon Ryan scored 2 points when introduced. They play Tyrone on Sunday in Tyrone at 1pm.

From the archives:

April 14th, 1962, Master Noel Farrell, Barraderry Kiltegan, won the best growing competition sponsored by Comhlucht Siuicre Eireann for boys U18. June 23rd, West Juvenile League final, Kiltegan 1-3, Stratford 1-3. A late point saved Stratford that Tuesday night in High Park. Replay the following week in Baltinglass, Kiltegan 1-5, Stratford 2-3. Kiltegan with better team forwards did not make use of midfield & time and time again missed golden opportunities. Stratford holding on grimly to a slender one-point lead with only seconds to go. Kiltegan forced a 14-yard free, but they kicked it wide.


