#### **WORLD MEETING OF FAMILIES 2018**

Families from across Ireland were in Knock, Co Mayo, last Monday to mark the oneyear countdown to next year's World Meeting of Families in Dublin.

Archbishop Diarmuid Martin, President and host of WMOF2018, presided at Mass in the Basilica where he preached on the theme <u>"When Plates Fly: Pope Francis on the joys and challenges of family life"</u>.

The WMOF2018 icon of the Holy Family was unveiled and anointed at the Mass from where it will begin a journey through the 26 Catholic dioceses in Ireland. The official <u>prayer</u> for the gathering was also presented at this Mass.

The World Meeting of Families was established by Pope Saint John Paul in 1994 to emphasise the central importance of marriage and the family and takes place every three years.

It will begin in Dublin on Tuesday, 21 August 2018, with a national opening which will take place simultaneously in all 26 dioceses to be followed by a three-day congress on "The Gospel of the Family: Joy for the World".
