TURNING TO GOD FOR FORGIVENESS THIS LENT

As we move closer to Holy Week, many people's thoughts turn to the sacrament of reconciliation as part of the journey of Lent. Unfortunately, at this time of restrictions our parishes are not in a position to make this sacrament freely available to people. But, of course, the forgiveness of God is always available to us and there are many ways in which we can experience God's mercy, love and forgiveness as we anticipate a future celebration of the sacrament.

You are very welcome to join us for an on-line Penitential Service on Wednesday, 31st March at 7.30 p.m. from St. Patrick's Church, Rathvilly.

This is a time of prayer, readings, reflection with an examination of conscience that often concludes with the praying of an Act of Contrition. This is a non-sacramental celebration of God's mercy and a rich preparation for a future celebration of the sacrament with individual confession and absolution.

Alternatively, in your own time, you can spend some time in prayer to God and make what is known as an act of perfect contrition. This involves two things on the part of the person: firstly, to pray an act of contrition out of love of God and secondly, to make a firm commitment to go to confession when that becomes possible.

An Act of Contrition

O my God, I thank you for loving me. I am sorry for all my sins, for not loving others and not loving you. Help me to live like Jesus and not sin again. Amen.
