Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Gospel Reflection Mark 9:30-37 Deacon Rev. Liam Dunne

In the Gospels, Jesus often identifies with those who had little or no social status at that time. In today's Gospel Reading, he identifies himself with a child. In the culture of that time, children had no social standing, no power or influence. They were valued for who they could become rather than for who they were. They were considered among the least. Yet Jesus says to his disciples, "Whoever welcomes one of these children in my name, welcomes me". He was trying to teach his disciples a lesson. They had just had an argument as to which of them was the greatest, who among them was the most important as the world assesses importance.

In identifying himself with a child, Jesus was declaring that social standing, importance, status, was not a value for him and was not one of the values of the Kingdom of God that Jesus came to proclaim. What is of value in God's Kingdom is becoming servant to all, including servant of those whom the world does not consider to have any standing or status, such as children.

Like the disciples, we can easily buy into a set of values that are not those of the Kingdom of God. It is only by keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus and becoming more attentive to his word that we allow his values to shape how we think and speak and act. Martin Hogan Copyright © Martin Hogan 2016.
