Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time Introduction to the Lenten Season

In the past, Lent was often seen as a time to look down on oneself. Words such as temptation, evil, sin and guilt were often dominant, leaving some people in darkness and despair. This was extremely damaging for many. Thankfully, today we are trying to let go of such language and see Lent for what it really is, a time for transformation and encounter. Indeed, for some people today, it is one of their favourite Church seasons! New Year resolutions are probably well out the window by the time Lent comes around, so in a real sense it brings us the opportunity of a new beginning, a chance to start again. Lent offers us a time for deep reflection, and for those of us who hear and read the Gospel each week during this season, the texts offer a richness that can bring freshness to our lives.

Lent is a journey of preparation for Easter, a time to refresh our relationship with God, with those we love and cherish, with those we find difficult to love and with God's creation. Lent is like a time of stocktaking: what's here that shouldn't be? What do I need to let go of? Where do I need to spend more time? The intention is not to beat ourselves up; rather, it is to set out on a journey that will help us live our best lives with our hearts open. This is what Jesus wants for us.

We read on the First Sunday of Lent that our first stop is the wilderness. Here we embrace three tools to assist us: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. A suggestion for this season might be to spend more time with God's Word, to give up some luxury and to either donate what you can to your favourite charity or give your time to something or someone. These practices help us to focus and to grow in deeper awareness of what it means to be a follower of Jesus.

During this time, it is good for us to remove ourselves from the normal routines, to be still, and to stop and breathe. We need not be afraid of this, for the Gospel shows us that time spent in the wilderness is Spirit-led, and we are not alone. We hope that you can use the following reflections to spend more time this lent with God's Word, in prayer for transformation, renewal and encounter with the One who journeys with us.

Eithne Condon 1936-2022

As we say our sad farewell to Eithne, who died on Wednesday last, we all marvel at her exceptional abilities to embrace life with whatever challenges it poses. A book could be written on her contribution to her family, her parish community, her wider civic community and her Church, all of which she dearly loved. The circles of friends who worked with her in a host of different settings deeply appreciated her wisdom and sterling qualities as a person of deep convictions and faith-based quality of life. She loved celebrations, she supported countless good causes, she was a leader in the youth movement (Macra na Tuaithe/ Foróige), founder of Rathvilly Tennis Club, member of the Irish Countrywomens' Association, a photographer, enjoyed card playing, a gifted organist and choir leader, organiser of activities for the Elderly, chair of various demanding committees both in County Carlow (Carlow Enterprise Board) and in her parish (School Board of Management and Parish Council). She supported every good development in her adopted area. In a time when voluntary agencies find it more difficult to attract leaders, her example of what is possible will shine out like a beacon. Thankfully, she lived to receive various recognitions of her life achievements: a Bene Merenti Medal (Papal Award for exceptional commitment in Church life), she was awarded Carlow Person of the Year for her Community Work. Her 80th Birthday was fittingly marked in December 2016. A person of great and deep prayer. May she now enjoy her reward with the Angels and Saints and all who have gone before her.
