FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT Luke 4:1-13

Deacon: Rev. Liam Dunne Led by the Spirit

In today's Gospel, Jesus is 'led by the Spirit' in the wilderness. By definition, a wilderness is a place that is uninhabited and inhospitable. It seems a strange place for Jesus to begin. He has returned 'full of the Holy Spirit' after being baptised by John, yet immediately that same Spirit leads him in the wilderness. The use in Greek of *in* rather than *into* indicates that Jesus is not left alone to be tempted; the Spirit leads him the entire time. The period of forty days reminds us of the forty years that the people of God wandered in the wilderness before they arrived in the promised land – 'a land with flowing streams ... a land of olive trees and honey' (Deut 8:1-10). Of course, Lent also lasts for forty days, a Spirit-led time when we undergo a process of renewal.

Luke places huge emphasis on the Holy Spirit. He is the only Gospel where Jesus returns from his wilderness interlude 'filled with the power of the Spirit'. Luke uses this expression to describe 'an emotional or spiritual fullness that overflows outwardly'. When Jesus emerges, he is ready to begin his ministry. The wilderness is not a place to be feared; it can be a place of transformation, a place where God is ultimately in control. It is a place of contemplation where we come face to face with God and with our true selves.

As we enter Lent, we hear the Spirit's call to trust. When we pause to take stock of the direction of our lives, we may encounter our own demons and temptations, but that is part of the process. Let us embrace this 'wilderness' season as a time of genuine spiritual, and Spirit-led, journeying. Copyright © Triona Doherty & Jane Mellett 2021.

Secondly, we pause at the Sign of Peace, a sign we understandably suspended during the pandemic. While not yet restoring the sign, let's take a moment of pause and reflection for the cause of peace and how we can all contribute to being peacemakers in today's world.

Thirdly, Prayer for peace in Ukraine to be prayed at every Mass during Lent.

Bishop Denis has invited people across the diocese to light a candle in their homes and to pray this prayer each day during lent:

Loving God, we pray for the people of Ukraine,

for all those suffering or afraid, that you will be close to them and protect them. We pray for world leaders, for compassion, strength and wisdom to guide their choices. We pray for the world that in this moment of crisis, we may reach out in solidarity to our brothers and sisters in need.

LISTENING LENT

Pope Francis wants to hear from the whole Church about the reality of being part of the People of God right now.
