Looking Back to over 50 years of Hurling in Kiltegan GAA Club.

The first hurling team to be affiliated was in 1970, we played one game in the West Junior Hurling Championship in Baltinglass and lost to Hollywood 7-06 to 4-05. One dozen hurleys cost the club eight shillings each, one dozen hurling balls fifteen shillings. Insuring the team cost three pounds. When the team returned back to Kiltegan that day some of the "hurlers on the ditch" as we call them passed the remark that secretary Timmins would have fire wood for the winter. In 1971 hurling made small progress we played five matches that year. More players were joining the club especially the students from St. Patricks Collage and some players from outside clubs came to give hurling a try, students and one priest from St. Patricks who played were Richard Burke, Mick Murphy, Kieran Bermingham and Fr. Mc Henry. Sean Byrne from Donard and Sean Walsh, Mick Scotch Moore, Kevin Holden from Stratford played one game. Fr. PJ McDonald CC Baltinglass and in later years PP of Hacketstown, Paddy Cullen, Martin Coleman, Peter McGrath, and Joe Doyle who had come to work in Quinns Baltinglass all played during the year.

Jerry McCarney Hacketstown came to Baltinglass to referee us against Hollywood in a league match and was pressured into playing, which left West Board Secretary Peter Keogh with the head ache of looking for another referee which delayed the start of the game. We played 5 games, won 2, drew 1, lost 2, scored 14 goals 34 points against was 19 goals 30 points. Nat Pearson was top scorer with 4 goals and 14 points.

We drew with Hollywood in the West Junior Hurling Championship 1-07 to 3-01, and won the replay 2-06 to 1-06. We were now in the first ever County Junior Hurling Semi Final. The first time since 1929 a Kiltegan team would be crossing the hills to play on the sacred county grounds in Aughrim. Because of long delays on the other side of the county the game would not be played until the following year 1972, the same was also true of the West League final which we were also in. At our November club meeting there was a request that the club buy more hurleys in case some of the matches were played and there was a chance of challenge match against Castledermot. The club treasurer Larry Daly (RIP) dug his heels in and said he would buy no more hurls as he had bought two sets already. The late Pa Leary left the meeting in protest followed by Mick Ryan, Sean Keogh and Nat Pearson were very vocal ,after much debate the meeting agreed with the treasurer and was bought to a close. We all looked forward to the next year.
