## Gospel: Luke 21:5-19 Do not be Afraid

As we approach the end of the Church year, we are also coming towards the end of Luke's Gospel, and things have taken a dark turn, Jesus has arrived in Jerusalem, which means, as we know, that he is on course for a violent death. In an intense monologue, upsetting for his companions, he speaks of earthquakes and famines, persecution and death. While those around him are enjoying the magnificence of the Temple, Jesus tells them it will be totally destroyed. This is an unimaginable event, which they easily take to signify the end of the world. Bleak words indeed.

This is Jesus' talk of the 'end-times', the kind we still sometimes hear at times of crisis. There have always been disasters in the world, from wars and plagues to earthquakes and tsunamis, and many people have interpreted these things as signs of the end of the world. We face our own personal disasters too, when we lose a loved one, when diagnosed with serious illness, when a relationship breaks-down. At times like that we feel as if our world is ending. The recent pandemic comes to mind as an example. For many of us, it felt the end of the world as we knew it, a neverending endurance test.

In today's Gospel, Jesus is preparing the disciples for what is about to happen to him, but in spite of the challenges ahead he offers encouragement: he will be with them. He promises 'words of wisdom' when they are in difficulty. When we are facing a crisis, Jesus tells us not to be afraid. When we feel hopeless about the sadness and destruction in the world, he is there. We keep going, as best we can, in the messiness and brokenness of life. ## **MATTERS FINANCIAL**

Parish Clergy generally hate commenting a lot on the financial situation of the Parish as they know that parishioners at large make big sacrifices to assist the Parish in meeting its monetary responsibilities. On the other hand, the people of the Parish have every right to know the facts.

Please note that the 2021 Statement of Accounts has been posted on the Church Notice Board in the three Churches. Like 2020, the year under review (2021) was much affected by the reality of the Coronavirus pandemic. However, generosity in supporting parish collections and fundraising continued almost as normal. There were some sizable refurbishment costs during the year, namely works on the Resurfacing of the Cemetery Extension in Rathvilly ( $\pounds$ 21,280) and repairs to roof and guttering of Talbotstown Church ( $\pounds$ 25,942). Good news is that under Other Income was a Grant from Carlow County Council covering the Resurfacing work at the Cemetery.

**INSURANCE**: You will note that the cost of insuring our Parish Buildings (3 Churches, 2 Parochial Houses and Kiltegan Hall) came to  $\notin$ 14,425. Income includes the payment of the Insurance of Kiltegan Hall by the Committee. Thus, we have a weekly amount of about  $\notin$ 250 needed for Insurance alone. That would make the offertory collection small when deducted.

**LOTTO:** We introduced weekly Parish Lotto during the pandemic and the support of the parish and work of promoters is admirable. It makes a profit for the parish each week (in 2021 about €280 and €180 at present). It would be good if new promoters came forward for both Rathvilly and Kiltegan parts of the parish and if new supporters at €2 per week were found. Please consider buying a line or selling a few lines per week. Convenient ways of paying for 10 weeks, or 3 or 6 or 12 months in advance are available. Forms are at the back of the Churches. **TAX REBATE:** The Parish has a Charity Number and as such is eligible for refunds of tax paid by our donors if their reckonable donations to the Parish reach €250 in the calendar year. In 2021 €9,622 in Income was received through this Scheme, which has been in operation since 2002. When you receive a CHY3 Form regarding this Scheme, please complete it and return to parish office. The Accounts of our Parish for 2021 show **a deficit** of €29,145, as compared with a 2020 deficit of €9.586. J McEvoy PP
