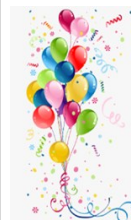

Looking back To 1974

After winning the Junior Championship in '73 and visiting the schools in the area the late Peter Keogh and John Timmins combined forces to get a new juvenile drive under way. The first move was to put a detailed proposal to the West Juvenile Board for a new schools league. The Board bought into the package and set up a small schools league and a large schools league in football. They were also pressured into running a schools hurling league and Peter Keogh pressurised his friend and Baltinglass business man Billy Lee to put up a cup for the competition, to give hurling a boost in West Wicklow which was known as the Lee Cup. The football team from Tynock/Talbotstown reached the final of the small schools league and were beaten by Vallymount 5-04 to 1-02.

In 1974 the football team won all their matches and again reached the final of the small schools league managed by John Timmins. They made no mistake this time and beat last years winners Vallymount in the final 6-07 to 3-01. A great display by the team.

The Hurling team managed by Peter Keogh and with John Timmins as selector won the first Lee Cup beating Dunlavin in the final by a wide margin. This was the start that juvenile hurling needed and it took off with a big drive for hurling in West Wicklow, with Kiltegan starting up teams in under 12 and 14, taking part in a Mini File in Kilkenny.

A new era of hurling was born and to the present day it has never looked back.
