#### Looking Back 1975

There was a big drive in the club in promoting juvenile hurling after winning the Lee Cup. We went in search of hurlers in Vallymount, Hollywood and our near neighbours Baltinglass, Knockananna and Ballymanus. We affiliated under 12 and under 14 teams for the first time. Our under 12 team went all the way and won the first ever County Juvenile Hurling title to come to West Wicklow. Team: John Byrne, Andy Coleman, Tom Cremin, Kieran O'Keefe, Seamus Farrell, Sean O'Sullivan, and Liam Healy both Vallymount Garrett Byrne, Kevin Byrne, John Halpin—Hollywood, Hugh Cullen, John Reid, Pat Mahan—Vallymount, Sean Gartland, Declan Byrne, Mick Kelly, Mickey Byrne and Declan Lawlor.

Our under 14 team also made it to the final but were beaten by a much experienced Carnew team. Finding challenge matches or any match for both teams early in 1975 was a big problem, also finding hurlers at the time was a major problem. John Timmins solved this problem by entering an under 14 hurling team in the Wicklow Community Games. After preparing a team and travelling to places like Ashford, Bray and Wicklow Town all we got out of this was walk-overs and we were crowned Wicklow Champions and we moved on to represent Wicklow in the Leinster Community Games. The boys at least got a medal out of Wicklow. We were drawn in the first round of Leinster against Castledermot in Newbridge, at the time the club had recruited a number of players from Baltinglass which included Con Murphy, Robert Mc Hugh, Ciaran Burke, Brian Kilcoyne, on the week of the Community Games match Con Murphy was playing for Wicklow in the Leinster u14 championship final against Westmeath and got a bad head injury and could not play the hurling match. On the morning of the match only Robert Mc Hugh turned up, the full team was transported to Newbridge in three cars by Peter Keogh, Ned Cremin and John Timmins, and we had one supporter Breda Cremin. The boys put up a great display and against all the odds we drew the match. John Murphy, Martin Dowling controlled mid field. Tom Cremin gave a great display at fullback, Ned Cremin was top scorer. John Keogh (Dreim), Joseph Shortall and Robert Mc Hugh started in the forwards. The replay was fixed for Baltinglass the following week but we never reached the heights of the week before and lost the match and also ended the Kiltegan participation in the Community Games.

Castledermot introduced two girls to their team and our lads were a bit taken aback at the sight of two girls playing on a boys team, this was unheard off. Who was going to mark them was the only question on our boys lips to which the reply was given "in a years time you will be looking for their addresses".

This was the story of Juvenile Hurling 1975.
