SUMMER FRUIT CRUMBLE

What you need:

125g/4oz Plain Flour

125g/4oz Demerara Sugar 175g/6oz Porridge Oats (optional)

125g/4oz Butter. Fruit of your choice - Apples, Rhubarb, Mixed Berries

How to:

Preheat oven to 190°C/375°F/Gas 5.


Put the flour into a bowl, add in butter and rub into flour with your fingers. Add in sugar and oats and mix together.

Prepare fruit. Stew apples/rhubarb if making apple/rhubarb crumble. Put fruit in ovenproof dish. Spoon crumble over fruit. Bake in oven for about 20 minutes.

To Stew Apples/Rhubarb

Peel, core and roughly chop apples. Or clean, trim and slice rhubarb stalks into 1"/21/2 cm pieces. Place in a saucepan with a sprinkling of sugar and a little water (3 tablespoons approx.) over a low heat, stirring occasionally until softened. If liked, add a pinch of cinnamon/ginger to the apples/ rhubarb when soft.

Serve with fresh cream, custard or ice cream.

The Women's Shed meet every Tuesday morning in St. Tegan's Hall from 10.00am to 12.30pm. Admission is €5. Strictly over 18 years.


