Our Junior Football team's good run in the Division 5 of the County Football League came to an end when they were ambushed by the Billy's in the semi-final of this league on Thursday evening in Knockananna. The final score Kiltegan 1-08 Ballymanus 1-10. We were warm favourites going into this match and started with two missed goal opportunities within five minutes till we scored our first point from Oisin Shortall. Points followed from Mark Ryan and Anthony Furlong and a great goal by JP Dalton put us ahead 1-04 to 0-02 after twenty minutes and it looked like we were going to cruse to victory when disaster struck. Mark Pierce was sent off on a straight red card. The Billy's seized the opportunity and came more and more into the game scoring a goal and a point to leave the match 1-04 each at the break. We gave a lot of the ball away in the second half, poor passing, a couple of bad wides and the dismissal of Mark Ryan and even when they had a player black carded we could not score in this ten minutes. We tried hard in the closing stages to get the winning goal but their keeper Mervyn Kinch brought off a great save to put the Billy's into the final against Donard/Glen, a team we had beaten twice in this league.

But the opposition started to come more into this game and had a number of chances before they scored a goal to leave the score at half time 2-10 to 1-11. A couple of changes at half time and we started to play again. But they would not go away even when Seanie Germaine scored our 3rd goal. We were back to the bad habits we had against Bray, giving away free's between the two 65 lines and we were again penalised by the free taker on the opposite team. A stop start performance but a step closer to the coveted semi-final spot. There is no hurling matches for the next three weeks as the football championship takes over.
