#### **KILTEGAN GAA & CAMOGIE NEWS**



Our Senior Hurlers took on Carnew Emmets in the semi final of this years County Senior Hurling Championship at a very wet and windy Aughrim, the prize a place in the county final against Brav in two weeks time. Sadly it was not to be for us as we were beaten on penalties. Kiltegan 1 Carnew 3, after 20 minutes of extra time. Carnew played with the wind in the first half and they made the most of it leading at half time 0-9 to 0-4 from Seanie Germaine from frees. After we played some what below par, we turned with the wind into the second half and again we were slow into the game. The introduction at half time of Podge O' Toole threw us a life line when he scored a great goal, the first score from play for either team. Scores were hard to come by, Carnew won nearly every ruck and there were many due to the conditions. We sometimes tried to play fancy fine day hurling which did not pay off due to the tight marking. We gifted them two points one from a short puck out the other when our goalie over carried the ball after a great save. With the exception of Podge O' Toole's goal, points from Rory Finn and Mark Murphy and Seanie Germain's 9 from frees, no other forward scored. The question has to be asked why we played with a two man full forward line when we had the wind? We only drew level with Carnew coming up to the 60 minute mark when Seanie scored from a free. He had a last minute chance in injury time to win the game from a free but pulled it wide to leave the score !-08 to 0-11. Extra time was called for and both teams making huge effort to win the game. We were a point ahead at the break but as the clock moved on they levelled and we again had a chance of winning but Seanie again pulled the ball wide. Penalties, which they won 3 to 1 and go on to play Bray Emmetts in the final.

Our Junior Football team bowed out of this years Junior C Football Championship on Thursday against Rathnew by a single point. Kiltegan 2-10 Rathnew 3-08. Rathnew got off to a flyer of a start with a goal inside 30 seconds, but our lads stood tall and fought their way back into the game and were leading at half time 2-06 to 2-5. The teams were level with five minutes to go they got a last minute point to win by the slenderest of margins. Our management team were out raged by some of the decision made by referee M. Molloy. Some of the tackling on our players should have warranted black cards, and when he sent off two of the Rathnew officials it took at least 4 minutes before resuming the game. He then only played 40 seconds of injury time. Those are the small margins in winning or loosing a game. Over all a great performance by this team with the players giving it there all. Well done to Pat "Judy" Keogh and his management team on their work with this team.

### Kiltegan Camogie News


