1998 A Great Year For The Club

25 years ago on the 18th October our Senior & Intermediate hurling teams brought off a great double for our club when they won both County Hurling Championships. Our Senior team beat Glenealy in the final 1-10 to 0-03 our second championship win in a row. Our intermediate team beat the favourites Carnew in the Intermediate final by 2-08 to 0-08. Our Junior hurling team also won the County B Junior Hurling Championship on the 8th August when they beat Arklow Rocks Parnell's in the final 4-08 to 2-07. Our Senior team also won the County Senior Hurling league beating St. Patricks Wicklow Town in the final and championship points on the 3rd August, scoreline Kiltegan 2-19 St Patricks 1-05. The Junior Hurling team also won the County Hurling league final on the 8th November beating Arklow Rocks 1-07 Kiltegan 3-08.

Our Senior Football team reached the County Senior Football Championship final on the 20th September, our last appearance was in 1986 when we won, but we found our bogey team Rathnew to hard to handle on the day when they beat us Kiltegan 0-03 Rathnew 1-07. Our Junior football team reached the quarter final of the Junior Football championship loosing after a replay to Lacken who went on to win the Junior Championship. What a year for the club. We played 25 Senior Football matches won 16, drew 2, lost 7. We played 12 Senior Hurling matches won 9, lost 3, we played 8 games in the championship & league in Wicklow loosing only 1 game to Glenealy. Two days after we played Bray-Emmets in the semi final of the Senior Football Championship. We played 9 Intermediate Hurling matches won 6 drew 2, lost 1. We played 6 Junior Hurling games won all 6. We played 13 Junior Football matches won 10,drew 2, lost 1. Playing a total of 49 matches that year.

The Winning Intermediate team of 1998 will be honoured at half time in the County Senior Hurling Final on Sunday in Aughrim. 25 years ago captain Michael O'Toole lead us out in Aughrim when we beat Carnew in the final. Kiltegan 2-08 Carnew 0-08. Mick will lead the team once again when they will receive a presentation from the sponsors Arklow Bay Hotel. There will be a reception organised by the County Board at 2pm up stairs in the county building. There is also an evening of entertainment in the Talk of the Town at 5pm. Our senior hurling team of three in a row were honoured last year.
