The ghost of Rathnew came back to haunt our Senior Football team again in the Senior Football championship as they beat us by a single point in the quarterfinal. Kiltegan 3-07 Rathnew 2-11. We were leading at half time 1-05 to 0-05, after playing some good direct football. Podge O'Toole had us on the scoreboard after 10 seconds, Liam Keogh added another as did Jack O'Toole and James Boland blocked down the ball from our own defence and ran the length of the field to score a fantastic goal. Rathnew were reduced to 14 men just before half time after a strike on Kieran Conway. It was 14 against 15 at the start of the second half with in five minutes a long ball from Brandon Ryan found Seanie Furlong who passed to the flying half back James Boland bang into the back of the net. Followed minutes later by a superb goal from Podge O'Toole to put us nine points up, 45 minutes gone in the game.
