A sad week for our community and GAA club with the deaths of two iconic gentlemen. John "Tickler" Byrne and Mark Pierce. We were saddened to hear on Sunday morning of

the death of another of our great characters John



(Tickler) Byrne. The community send sincere sympathies to Veronica. Damien, Eugene. Raymond, Shaun, and all John's extended familv & friends. John never kicked football or pucked a hurling ball with the GAA club, he was never a member of the committee but the work he did, travelling the length and breadth of the county promoting the club lotto, kick-starting

lotto sales within the Hacketstown. Baltinglass and Rathvilly areas. Every weekend John sold lotto tickets within all the local pubs sharing the craic and banter as he went – always with a great story to tell whilst accompanied by his friendly

John could sell sand to the Arabs. There wasn't a week went by when he wasn't knocking at the door with a 5 week draw card, tickets for a pony or pig. he must have travelled half of Ireland selling lines at 50p for Kiltegan Lord Mayor the late Peter Keoah.

John also put in trojan work over the years helping to prepare and gather lots for Michael Dwvers auctions, following Féile teams nationwide. He drove many team to Féile competitions, and groups to dinner dances and functions some extremely late nights all over the county with Duffy Coach Hire. He could be called upon for help for car parking, events, and any activities where help was needed within our club. John was immensely proud of all his sons' achievements especially in sporting circles both on and off the field. »»»»

Kiltegan GAA and our entire community were devastated to learn of the sudden death of our friend and team mate Mark Pierce on Sunday night. Our club extend our sincere and heartfelt



sympathies to Mark's heartbroken family, his partner Niki, dad Derek, sister Leona, brothers Daniel & Philip, his son James, brother-in-law John, Daniel's partner Trish and Philip's partner Rachel, nephews and nieces TJ, Ella, Jamie, Katie and Billy and all Mark's extended family and friends. The thoughts of everyone in our area and beyond are with you all.

Mark was a talented dual player with our club which was evident from a very young age. Mark went to school in Talbotstown and spent much of his young and adult life in his second home in Dowling's in Brockna where he was treated as a member of the family. Mark was introduced to hurling & football by the late Peter Keogh. He soon joined up with Kiltegan GAA club, coming up through the ranks of underage, into Michael Dwyers and moving onto play both Junior & Senior hurling and football.

Mark brought sheer intensity and strength to every match he played with clear ability in both codes. Mark' passion and drive was immense and when he hit form, he was unbelievable. Mark was himself and wore his heart on his sleeve, which may not have always brought him out on the right side of his teammates, manager, or man in the middle. Suffice to say, there were times that the referee may have found the need to take out his notebook, and maybe even extract a coloured card. Mark often left matches declaring to teammates and managers, "that's it now, I'm done", but he was always the first in the field for training the next session having the craic and all was forgotten. That's what made Mark Mark. A more honest driven player you wouldn't find and his love for Kiltegan GAA, his teammates and gaelic games was unquestionable.

Mark trained hard and aside from team training he spent hours at the club, kicking, pucking and practising his sidelines. He fancied himself as a great man for a sideline and his favourite line was always "How much would ya give me if I put it over?" – let's just say he didn't get rich! Mark had the kindest heart; a great sense of humour and he would do anything for anyone. He had a natural ability for encouraging and building confidence amongst the younger players coming up through the ranks in our club. It may have been a quiet word to a young lad pucking the ball against the hurling wall or a pat on the back after a game, but he certainly has left a lasting impression on many a young lad in our club. As well as the time he committed as an adult dual player of Kiltegan GAA, he supported our juvenile teams all over the county.

Off the playing field, Mark gave us many's the laugh, off the cuff on nights out. Decked out in his customary check shirt, with the craic flowing, the playing spoons would come out of his pocket and Mark entertained us all. Friends recall the night he walked into "Katies", chanting repeatedly "Hup, Hup," and continued to perform a dance over and back across the floor, bringing happiness and good humour in the door with him. This was why Mark was a lovable rogue.

Mark's death has hit hard and leaves a deep void in our club, community and beyond and we are going to miss him terribly. Fly high Mark xx.

Mark will be laid to rest Friday 17th November 2023.
