

Tommy gave a lot of his life to the GAA first as a player with Knockananna in the early years before moving across the border to Clonmore where he played for many years. Padar Daly and himself were on two loosing Clonmore teams that reached Carlow County senior finals in 1965 & 66. He refereed several Kiltegan 7-a -side tournament matches for our club during the 70's. He represented Wicklow on Central Council for twelve years, he also held top jobs on the Co. Board such as Co.
