John 1:35-42 "Come and see"

In todays extract from John's Gospel, we hear how Jesus invites his friends to 'come and see'. The invitation arises from a short exchange with two of John's disciples who have begun to follow Jesus. 'What are you looking for?' Jesus asks, and their response is simple: 'Rabbi, where are you staying?' Rather than telling them, Jesus extends a hand a friendship and welcome, and the disciples stay with him in his home for the day. They would have talked and listened, eaten and drunk with him, all of the building blocks of friendship. Jesus' invitation is intimate. He wants his friends to spend time with him and get to know him. This precious time with Jesus is life-changing, laying the foundation for a lifetime of discipleship.

We might remember as children being invited to visit a friend's home. It was always a big step in cementing a friendship and getting to know someone on a deeper level. Our close friends always have a warm welcome for us; it can be lovely to visit a longtime friend after they've moved house, to see how that person' character and hospitality transfer into a new space, just because of the person who inhabits it. Today, we hear the call of Jesus to 'come and see'. To all who seek him, he is ready and waiting for us to spend time with him, learn from him, receive his gift of friendship and love. As we reflect on the inviting love of Jesus, we are encouraged to extend a warm welcome to others in a spirit of friendship. Pope Francis has often spoken of our responsibility as individuals, communities, and Church, to welcome everyone – including those who are homeless or who have been forced to leave their home or country. One example of this is the generosity of those who have opened up their homes to people fleeing war. Our welcome to others is a response to the call of Jesus to love the other, the stranger, as ourselves.
