Looking Back 50 Years to 1974

Our AGM was held in St. Tegan's Hall on the 19th January 1974 at 2.30pm. Martin Dogue was appointed trainer for the coming year in football and hurling. It was a year to remember and forget as we drew a blank on the playing field. We reached 5 finals, 3 in football 2 in hurling.

Our football team lost the by a single point 0-9 to 0-8 to Blessington who went on to win the championship. We lost the Corcoran Cup final to the same opposition by a point and loosing another cup final to Hollywood.

In hurling we were now playing intermediate after winning the junior championship the year before. We lost the league final to Carnew, also loosing the county intermediate final to Avoca 3-7 to 0-11. After an objection and counter objections and many meeting a reply was ruled by the Co. Board for which Avoca declined to play. The cup was awarded to Kiltegan, but we declined to take the cup so the Co. Board ruled the championship null and void for 1974.

In football we played 31 matches 24 by the A team & 7 by the B team. In all 54 players played football this year. Tom Pearson was top scorer with 8 goals & 38 point. Peter Keogh & Michael Fonell played all 31 games.

In hurling we played 14 matches won 7 lost 7. Played 1 junior hurling match loosing to Kilbride in the championship 3-11 to 2-2. Nat Pearson R.I.P. was our top scorer with 2-21. 39 players played hurling this year. Between football & hurling we played 45 matches won 21 drew 3 lost 21, in all 67 players played at some time during the year.

We started training on Tuesday 9th April & finished on Tuesday 3rd December.
