Thanks to the community members who donated bikes to our call out recently. They are much appreciated, and more to follow in the coming weeks about the bikes!

We have been fortunate to receive a donation of bare root trees from Wicklow County Council -Environmental Awareness Officer for the community and these will be planted by the committee before the end of April.

But we have more than we require for the areas we are hoping to plant in and so: we are asking members of the community who would like to plant a tree in their garden/on their land to contact us, as we would like to make trees available to our community. Max 5 per person. The tree varieties are; Oak, Birch, Alder, Hazel, Beech, Hawthorn & Scott's Pine.

They are slips today, but in 20 years from now, they will form part of our local tree coverage. If you are interested, please contact Aine on 087 2795066. The slips will need to be planted before the end of April.
