Palm Sunday – Deacon: Rev. Liam Dunne Luke 19:28-40 Holy Holy

In this reflection we focus on Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem, which we read about at the beginning of the Palm Sunday Liturgy. This whole account speaks to us of ritual: an occasion for praising Jesus, welcoming him, giving thanks for all that has occurred. For the crowds who gather it is a triumph; their Messiah has arrived at the centre of their world, the Jerusalem Temple. In Luke's account, Jesus goes ahead of everyone else, leading the way. The image of the colt is significant. Leaders of that era would enter into a city in a parade full of pomp and ceremony, on white horses with all the trappings of grandeur on display. We see this reflected even today, when dignitaries arrive in expensive jets or impressive limousines, stepping on to red carpets. These are all symbols of power, and Jesus' message deeply challenges those systems of power. His mission has been different from the start – a radical reversal, a lesson in expecting the unexpected. It was shepherds, not Roman emperors, who paid homage to him in a stable, and here he arrives to the holiest of cities on a donkey.

We are told that 'the whole multitude of his disciples began to praise God joyfully with a loud voice saying, "Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!"' This joyful hymn is the origin of the 'Holy Holy' in our liturgies. We may well ask ourselves: Do we sing this as joyfully as they did, in gratitude for Jesus and for all the miracles in our lives? Their singing is an echo of the song of the angels as they rejoiced with the shepherds following Jesus' birth. Christ has come for all those who are marginalised in our world, and to challenge the root causes of oppression. Luke's entire Gospel has been moving towards this moment. The crowd is wildly excited. We know, however, how the rest of this Holy Week unfolds.
