Easter Sunday - Deacon: Rev. Liam Dunne

Gospel: John 20:1-9 A New Beginning

There is palpable excitement in the Gospel passage we hear today. We find in it a lot of frantic running and breathless storytelling. Mary Magdalene rushes in a panic from the empty tomb to tell the others. Peter and John take off at a run, with the important detail included that John outruns Peter! Chaos reigns in their hearts as they look at the scene, until it dawns on them that Jesus really has risen from the dead. The empty tomb means one thing: Jesus is alive! Their despair quickly turns to joy.

Easter is a time for hope and new beginnings. Our celebration on Easter morning is like that first warm day of spring when we throw open the windows and let the light and fresh air in. As followers of Christ, we share this morning in the energy and excitement of the disciples. Jesus has risen and life will never be the same. When the disciples enter the tomb, the linen coverings in which Jesus' body had been wrapped are empty and placed aside. It is a poignant sign that Jesus has left the bonds of death. In order to enter fully into the new hope of Easter, what are the burdens that we can leave behind in the tomb? Let the stone that has been rolled back and the linen wrappings represent all that prevents us from being free, all that keeps us captive emotionally, physically and spiritually.

Our Church has not always communicated well the Easter message of joy. At times, it has been more inclined to place heavy burdens on people than to lift them into true freedom and fullness of life. Our challenge is to live as Easter People. With our joy and our passions, our loves and our desire to live life to the full, let us declare that Jesus is risen!
