Gospel: Luke 10:25-37 A Famous Parable

In today's gospel, we read of a lawyer who is trying to trick Jesus by asking him, 'Who is my neighbor?' Jesus' response is the parable of the Good Samaritan, where he tells the story of a man who is left half dead by robbers on his way from Jerusalem to Jericho. Our attention is drawn to the three characters who come upon the scene. The priest, the Levite and the Samaritan all 'see' the injured man, but the first two decide to 'pass by'. Those listening to this parable may well have found themselves sympathizing with the priest and the Levite, since there were purity laws concerning contact with blood or a dead body. However, they were also bound by a responsibility to save the man's life. This responsibility should override any other concern. It is most likely that the priest and the Levite were carrying oil and wine with them to make sacrifice in the Temple. If so, they could have been used to clean the wounds of the injured man, since oil and wine were vital parts of a first-century first-aid kit. Implicit here is a question about how we truly worship God.

So which of the three is truly a neighbor to this man? Jesus reveals the hero of this parable to be the third, a Samaritan. This would have sparked outrage among those listening, since Jews and Samaritans were enemies. Yet it is the Samaritan – the enemy – who is moved with pity, *[compassion]* binds the man's wounds, pours oil on them and takes him to an inn. He gives money to pay for his stay, but more importantly he gives his time, caring for the man's immediate and long-term needs.

The emphasis in this parable is on compassion and action. Jesus points to a God who is not concerned with the boundaries we create, but who is on the streets with the injured, offering healing and mercy. The lawyer's question is about what limits are to be placed on neighbourly love. Jesus tells us that there are no limits in God's eyes.
