## 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Deacon: Rev. Liam Dunne

Gospel: Luke 17:11-19 Thank you

What a difference an attitude of gratitude makes! In today's Gospel, the life of the man who turns back to thank Jesus is utterly transformed. The other nine receive the same gift of healing, but they do not acknowledge the gift or the giver. In thanking Jesus, the Samaritan man enters into a relationship with him; he becomes his disciple.

During the early days of the COVID-19 pandemic, there was an outpouring of gratitude for healthcare workers. People stood outside their homes to clap for the Nurses, Doctors and First Responders who were putting their lives on-the-line. There were campaigns for better pay conditions for them, and appeals to the public to play their part in keeping these heroes safe. But over time the clapping stopped and the media spotlight moved on, though of course the selfless work continued.

Gratitude makes us aware that we are part of something bigger than ourselves by being connected to others in the world. Pope Francis has spoken of the importance of saying 'thank you' in family life, and he suggests that we should give thanks before and after meals: "That moment of blessing, however brief, reminds us of our dependence on God for life, it strengthens our feelings of gratitude for the gifts of creation; it acknowledges those who in their labour provide us with these goods; and it reaffirms our solidarity with those in greater need".

We slip easily into the habit of turning to prayer only when we need something. But what about after the storm has passed? Jesus asks the question, "The other nine, where are they?" Perhaps they simply got on with their lives and, over time, let the memory fade.
