# 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Deacon: Rev. Liam Dunne

Gospel: Luke 18:1-8 Crying out

The judge in the parable we hear about today is hardly a role model. He delivers justice to the widow, not because he cares, but because he wants to get rid of her. He is painted in contrast with God who is full of compassion, particularly for those most in need. When we cry out, God hears us. On the surface, the parable seems to be about the need to persevere in prayer but, like all Jesus' parables, it has layers of meaning. At the time of Jesus, many widows were left without resources following the death of their husbands. Jewish listeners would have been aware that the Hebrew Scriptures called for the protection of widows as well as the poor and foreigners, so the women in today's parable represents all these vulnerable groups.

Today's vulnerable people continue to cry out for justice, and their cries often fall on deaf ears. As a society, are we like the unjust judge, ignoring them and hoping they will go away or that someone else will deal with them? Do we offer a half-hearted response, just to soothe our conscience? Or is our response rooted in a real sense of compassion and justice?

There is another sting-in-the-tail of today's Gospel. Almost as an afterthought, Jesus poses a challenge. "But when the Son of Man comes, will he find any faith on earth?" The real question is not whether our prayer can move God, but rather, Jesus suggests, if our prayer can move us. Does our faith spur us into action? The widow refused to stop fighting until justice was granted. We cannot sit back and expect our prayer to be answered without effort on our part.
