John 3:16-18 Divine energy

‘God so loved the world ...’ Our short Gospel passage today is familiar. It is known as one of the most concise expressions of Christian faith. Jesus is speaking to Nicodemus, a Jewish leader who has come to him with a series of questions. We, too, seek to understand who Jesus is. Jesus explains that the key to the mystery is love: God loved the world so much that God became one of us. The creative love of God, in the world and part of the world since the beginning of time (Jn 1:3, 10), reaches its climax in the incarnation.

Something of this creative love is expressed in the parent–child relationship. The all-encompassing love of a parent for their child is a model of the intimacy between creator and creature. A parent wants the best for a child, to hold them close, to protect them from harm, to fill them with love and hope. The inseparable bond between a mother and the child she has carried and nurtured in her body has an energy of its own. As the child grows, the love between parent and child continues to flow, sustaining the child, connecting them always with the love from whence they came. In a similar way, the Spirit weaves and flows through our lives, joining us with the source of divine love. The mystery of the Trinity is that God is a relationship of love. And Jesus is the way into this great mystery of God’s presence in creation, in our world, in ourselves, in one another. ‘Jesus is the model and metaphor for all of creation being drawn into this infinite flow of love. Through Jesus, God invites us into the divine nature, so we can share and participate in it. We are ‘pulsing with divine energy’, and on this foundation we build our lives of love.
